

At Lloyd Williamson Schools, French is taught from Nursery Cherubs up to year 10. French is taught by native speakers whose aim is to make the learning of French a rewarding and enriching experience. The pupils develop their language skills in a stimulating environment, by communicating early on in writing and orally while, at the same time, building a solid grammar basis. Enjoyment and rigour are the main guiding principles in our lesson planning.

We cover the Cambridge IGCSE curriculum. This syllabus is designed for students who are learning French as a foreign language. The aim is to develop an ability to use the language effectively for practical communication. The course is based on the linked language skills of listening, reading, speaking and writing, and these are built on as learners progress through their studies.

The syllabus also aims to offer insights into the culture of countries where French is spoken, thus encouraging positive attitudes towards language learning and towards speakers of other languages.
