Aims

The primary goals of this course are to:

- Develop students' ability to communicate confidently and accurately in French.

- Foster students' skills in listening, speaking, reading, and writing French.
- Encourage students to develop a lifelong interest in the French language.
- Prepare students for the Cambridge IGCSE French examination.

What The Student Will Learn

Language Skills

Students will develop their ability to:

- Understand spoken and written French.
- Communicate effectively in French through speaking and writing.
- Use correct grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation.

Cultural Understanding

Students will learn about:

- French-speaking countries and their cultures.
- Contemporary French society and issues.



How We Teach the Course

We use a variety of teaching methods to make learning French engaging and effective:

- Communicative language teaching: Students will practice speaking and listening in class.
- Grammar and vocabulary exercises: Students will build their language knowledge.
- Reading and writing activities: Students will develop their reading and writing skills.
- Cultural studies: Students will learn about French-speaking countries and cultures.
- Use of authentic materials: Students will listen to and read authentic French materials.

Assessment

Assessment will be based on the Cambridge IGCSE French examination, which consists of:

- Listening
- Reading
- Writing
- Speaking

Students will receive regular feedback on their progress through classwork, homework, and examination practice including full mock examinations.

Additional Learning Opportunities

To enhance language learning, students are encouraged to:

- Watch French films and TV programmes.
- Eat out in French restaurants.
- Listen to French music.
- Read French books and magazines.
- Participate in family organised trips to French-speaking countries.

By immersing themselves in the French language and culture, students will develop a strong foundation for future language learning.
